HEADBAND - Size F crochet hook

Chain 40 (approximately 7.5")

SC in 3rd stitch from end; ch 2, turn.

SC in 1st stitch and top of ch from previous row; ch 2, turn.

SC in base of ch 2, the next stitch and the top of ch 2 from previous row. Ch 3, turn.

*Skip the base of chain 3, and DC in the next 2 stitches and the top of the ch 3 from previous row==4 DC...

Repeat from * for 11.5" from beginning of headband (exclude ties). End chain 1, turn.

SC in first 2 stitches; sl at in top of chain 3; ch 1, turn.

SC in first 2 stitches; sl at in top of chain 1; ch 1, turn.

SC in first stitch; sl at in top of chain 1; ch 1, turn.

SI stitch in first stitch; chain 37 (approx. 7") for tie. Finish off ends by weaving them back up into the tie with a tapestry needle.

CROCHETED HEADBAND EMBELLISHMENTS

CROCHET KEY: ch-chain; sc-single crochet; dc-double crochet; tr treble (triple) crochet; sl-slip stitch



HEART Hook Size – J or K

Make a magic ring, ch 3.

Work 3 tr in the ring, 3 dc in the ring, ch 1, 1 tr in ring, ch 1, 3 dc in ring, 3 tr in ring, ch 3, sl in ring. Leave about an 8" tail, cut yarn, and pull through stitch. On the underneath side of the heart, grab the yarn tail and pull to draw the center of the ring tightly closed; secure using a tapestry needle. (Do Not Cut Tail.) With the tapestry needle, bring yarn from top to underneath side and secure. (Do Not Cut

Tail.) With tapestry needle, use one of the strands of yarn to attach beads, buttons, etc. in middle of heart on top side. Use other strand to attach heart to headband.



PETAL FLOWER Hook Size – G (YO = yarn over)

Make a magic ring, ch 1, 10 sc in magic ring. SI st into the first st (10 sc sts).

Petal Stitch: *ch 4, YO, insert hook into first sc and pull yarn through (you will have 3 loops on the hook); YO and draw the hook through first 2 loops; YO, insert hook into the same sc and pull through. (You will now have 4 loops on the hook.)

YO and draw the hook through the first 2 loops (now there are 3 loops on the hook). Finally, YO and draw the yarn through the last 3 loops; ch 4; sc into next

stitch.* Repeat from * to * until your very last st is into the st next to the first petal formed. Leave about an 8" tail, cut yarn, and pull through stitch.

Finishing Flower: On the underneath side of the flower, grab the yarn tail and pull to draw the center of the ring tightly closed; secure using a tapestry needle. (Do Not Cut Tail.) With the tapestry needle, bring yarn from top to underneath side and secure. (Do Not Cut Tail.) With tapestry needle, use one of the strands of yarn to attach beads, buttons, etc. in middle of flower on top side. Use other strand to attach flower to headband.



BUTTERFLY Hook Size – J or K

Make a magic ring, ch 3.

Work 3 tr in magic ring, ch 3, sl st in ring, ch 2, 2 dc in ring, ch 2, 2 sl in ring, ch 2, 2 dc in ring, ch 2, sl st in ring, ch 3, 3 tr in ring, ch 3, 1 sc in ring. Leaving about an 8" tail, cut yarn, and pull through stitch.

Finishing Butterfly: On underneath side of butterfly, grab the yarn tail and pull to draw the center of the ring tightly closed; secure using a tapestry needle. (Do Not

Cut Tail.) With the tapestry needle, bring yarn from top to underneath side and secure.

Abdomen and Antennae: To create abdomen and antennae, cut a black piece of yarn (or use a coordinating color) about 9" long. Option 1: Leaving about a 2½-3" tail, wrap the yarn around the middle of the butterfly twice. Tie ends in a double knot. Trim antennae. (Embroidery floss may be used in place of the yarn). Option 2 (with embellishments): Using a tapestry needle and leaving about a 2½-3" tail, secure yarn in the middle of the back side of the butterfly. Wrap around toward front of butterfly and add embellishments on the needle and position on front of butterfly. Wrap around to back side again and secure the yarn in the middle. Wrap toward front side again, going through embellishments again. Secure at top of middle on front side with the tapestry needle. Tie the ends in 2-3 knots; trim antennae.
