
FABRIC MAZE




Items needed:

2 fabric rectangles, 7" x 10"
2 contrasting fabric squares, 1 ½" x 1 ½"
2 pony beads (any color)
Sewing machine with thread

Instructions:

- Fold contrasting squares in half. Sew to opposite corners of one fabric rectangle. These are the start and finish corners.
- Sew fabric rectangles with right sides together. Leave opening for turning. Use 1/4" seam allowance.
- 3. Turn fabric rectangle right side out. Press.
- Center maze pattern over BACK of fabric rectangle (side WITHOUT contrasting squares).
- Stitch the maze pattern to the fabric rectangle. YES, STITCH THROUGH THE PAPER. Use a tight zigzag stitch or a reinforcing stitch.
- 6. Tear the paper off of the back of the maze.
- 7. Insert two pony beads into opening and push into center of maze.
- Topstitch close to outside edge of the maze, stitching over opening so that is it closed.



This maze is FUN!!! It is perfect for any 5 - 9 age box and possibly any 2 - 4 box. I have watched kids play for hours, driving the beads through the maze from one corner to the other. The beads are inside of the fabric so nothing can be lost or swallowed ©

HELPFUL HINT... Use contrasting fabrics for the two sides of the maze. It makes it more fun! Also use contrasting thread to sew the maze pattern onto the fabric.
