CONSEQUENCES

What about the consequences of sin in our lives?

As believers, do we have a license to sin?

Does God expect us to turn and repent of our sin and walk in victory?

Romans 6:1-2 What should we say then? Should we continue in sin so that grace may multiply? Absolutely not! How can we who died to sin still live in it?

Are there consequences?

Galatians 6:7-8 Don't be deceived: God is not mocked. For whatever a man sows he will also reap, because the one who sows to his flesh will reap corruption from the flesh, but the one who sows to the Spirit will reap eternal life from the Spirit.

Numbers 32:23b ...be sure your sin will catch up with you.

So lets take a look at some of the consequences you and I can expect.

1. There is a loss of true joy

Romans 14:17 for the kingdom of God is not eating and drinking, but righteousness, peace, and joy in the Holy Spirit.

One of the privileges of knowing Jesus is the joy of the Lord.

Unconfessed sin in our lives causes a lack of joy.

Think about David

Psalm 51:8-13 Let me hear joy and gladness; let the bones You have crushed rejoice. Turn Your face away from my sins and blot out all my guilt.

God, create a clean heart for me and renew a steadfast spirit within me. Do not banish me from Your presence or take Your Holy Spirit from me.

Restore the joy of Your salvation to me, and give me a willing spirit. Then I will teach the rebellious Your ways, and sinners will return to You.

2. There is a grieving and quenching of the Holy Spirit

Ephesians 4:30 And don't grieve God's Holy Spirit. You were sealed by Him for the day of redemption.

1 Thessalonians 5:19 Don't stifle the Spirit.

When sin goes unconfessed and unrepentant of then we open the door to the Holy Spirit not being allowed to work.

We prevent Him from performing His work on our behalf.

Remember some of what the Holy Spirit does for us...

-speaks to us
-guides and directs our
lives
-empowers us in ministry
-strengthens us

-convicts us of sin -produces Christlike character -helps us know God's Will

John R. Rice said it this way in his book "When a Christian Sins"

"The Holy S-iris lives in every Christians body. Yet, when a Christian sins he loses all contact with that same Holy Spirit. It seems as if the Holy Spirit, like an ill-treated and offended guest, shuts Himself up in His own small room in the heart and does not enjoy the fellowship of the inmate who has so grieved Him and wronged Him."

Can you really afford to lose the power of the Holy Spirit in all these areas of your life?

3. There is a reproach brought on Christ, the church, and His word

Unconfessed sin brings a mark to the name of Christ.

We damage the work of the Lord and the church.

HYPOCRITES

We sin freely and the world sees it.

We sin and don't do anything about it and the world sees it.

Think about those who fall in ministry.

Everyone talks!

4. There is a lack of answered prayer

Matthew 7:7 "Keep asking, and it will be given to you. Keep searching, and you will find. Keep knocking, and the door will be opened to you.

The Bible makes it clear that God wants to hear and answer the prayers of His people.

Isaiah 59:1-2 Indeed, the Lord's hand is not too short to save, and His ear is not too deaf to hear. But your iniquities have built barriers between you and your God, and your sins have made Him hide His face from you so that He does not listen.

Wouldn't it seem like God was condoning our sin by answering our prayers in the middle of it?

As you can see our unconfessed sin hinders our relationship with the Lord.

What is it in your life that is blocking fellowship with the Lord?
