BEFORE THE CONSEQUENCES...

SIN

GENESIS 3

Genesis 3:6-10 Then the woman saw that the tree was good for food and delightful to look at, and that it was desirable for obtaining wisdom. So she took some of its fruit and ate it; she also gave some to her husband, who was with her, and he ate it.

Then the eyes of both of them were opened, and they knew they were naked; so they sewed fig leaves together and made loincloths for themselves.

Then the man and his wife heard the sound of the Lord God walking in the garden at the time of the evening breeze, and they hid themselves from the Lord God among the trees of the garden.

So the Lord God called out to the man and said to him, "Where are you?" And he said, "I heard You in the garden and I was afraid because I was naked, so I hid."

I hope we all know that we are not supposed to sin.

Why is it wrong to sin? Are we supposed to be perfect? What do we do when we sin? Is all sin bad?

Well let's look at the cost.

1. Sin always brings shame.

Genesis 3:10

Genesis 3:10 And he said, "I heard You in the garden and I was afraid because I was naked, so I hid."

Sin in the life of the believer always brings shame. Sin will hamper the relationship with the Lord no matter how big or how little.

Why?

Sin is always sin!

This is why they chose to hide.

It's like being a child and having to face your parents when you chose to disobey.

Ex. The pointer

If you can freely sin and not feel ashamed, then you had better question if you are really saved.

2. Sin urges us to blame someone else.

Genesis 3:12-13

Genesis 3:12-13 Then the man replied, "The woman You gave to be with me—she gave me some fruit from the tree, and I ate." So the Lord God asked the woman, "What is this you have done?" And the woman said, "It was the serpent. He deceived me, and I ate."

Blame-shifting has been around since the beginning of time.

How many times have you and I been caught in the middle of something and our first thought is who can we put this on.

You see it every day in the political world. You see it every day in the business world.

The sad thing is when we sin, we want to blame our parents, our spouse, our kids, our circumstances, God, and the devil.

Maybe we should take responsibility.

As a matter of fact the Bible makes it clear who to blame.

James 1:14-15 But each person is tempted when he is drawn away and enticed by his own evil desires. Then after desire has conceived, it gives birth to sin, and when sin is fully grown, it gives birth to death.

Adam and Eve intentionally sinned. They knew what not to do and did it anyway

Don't we do the same?

A couple of examples.

-gossip (the church body killer)

Proverbs 16:28 A contrary man spreads conflict, and a gossip separates close friends.

Gossip in the name of prayer is gossip.

-lust and pornography (doesn't hurt anyone)

Matthew 5:28 But I tell you, everyone who looks at a woman to lust for her has already committed adultery with her in his heart.

Remember that the Devil can not make me do it.

3. Sin separates us from a Holy God.

Genesis 3:23-24

Genesis 3:23-24 So the Lord God sent him away from the garden of Eden to work the ground from which he was taken. He drove man out and stationed the cherubim and the flaming, whirling sword east of the garden of Eden to guard the way to the tree of life.

Isaiah 59:2 But your iniquities have built barriers between you and your God, and your sins have made Him hide His face from you so that He does not listen.

So the question becomes, "how do you keep from sin?"

Psalm 119:11 I have treasured Your word in my heart so that I may not sin against You.

1 John 1:9 If we confess our sins, He is faithful and righteous to forgive us our sins and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness.
