"Yesterday's thrill is today's old news. We always need more." Two views of satisfaction

1. Human view

I'm satisfied when things are going well and I'm getting what I want.

2. Biblical view

I'm satisfied when I allow God to fill my life and enrich it with His presence. **Biblical satisfaction is** not a natural or easy thing. It only occurs when we receive it from God.

Philippians 4:12 I know both how to have a little, and I know how to have a lot. In any and all circumstances I have learned the secret of being content—whether well fed or hungry, whether in abundance or in need.

Ecclesiastes 3:1-15 There is an occasion for everything, and a time for every activity under heaven: a time to give birth and a time to die; a time to plant and a time to uproot; a time to kill and a time to heal; a time to tear down and a time to build;

a time to weep and a time to laugh; a time to mourn and a time to dance; a time to throw stones and a time to gather stones; a time to embrace and a time to avoid embracing;

a time to search and a time to count as lost; a time to keep and a time to throw away; a time to tear and a time to sew; a time to be silent and a time to speak; a time to love and a time to hate; a time for war and a time for peace.

What does the worker gain from his struggles? I have seen the task that God has given people to keep them occupied. He has made everything appropriate in its time. He has also put eternity in their hearts, but man cannot discover the work God has done from beginning to end

I know that there is nothing better for them than to rejoice and enjoy the good life. It is also the gift of God whenever anyone eats, drinks, and enjoys all his efforts.

I know that all God does will last forever; there is no adding to it or taking from it. God works so that people will be in awe of Him. Whatever is, has already been, and whatever will be, already is. God repeats what has passed.

Let's take a look at a couple of principles in regards to satisfaction

1. Satisfaction occurs when we rely on the sovereignty of God.

Vs. 1-8

Sovereignty:

all things come from God all thing depend on Him God is in control

Satisfaction comes when we relinquish control to God.

The pairs listed in this passage tell us about who is in charge.

Born/Die

How much control do you really have?

Ex. Your next breath

2. Satisfaction occurs when we rest in the providence of God.

Vs. 9-11

Ecclesiastes 3:11 He has made everything appropriate in its time. He has also put eternity in their hearts, but man cannot discover the work God has done from beginning to end.

God's providence orders the events of our lives.

Do you believe God will guide you through all of life?

God's providence will guide you even in difficult and unsettling times.

Human satisfaction is based on circumstances, but biblical satisfaction is based on the nature of God.

Hebrews 13:5 I will never leave you or forsake you.

3. Satisfaction occurs when we seek eternal significance.

Vs. 11

Ecclesiastes 3:11 He has made everything appropriate in its time. He has also put eternity in their hearts, but man cannot discover the work God has done from beginning to end.

Giving our hearts and lives to a cause that will outlive us.

Making a difference in eternity.

What is the only thing that will make that difference?

The Gospel

4. Satisfaction occurs when we trust the plan of God.

Vs. 11

Ecclesiastes 3:11 He has made everything appropriate in its time. He has also put eternity in their hearts, but man cannot discover the work God has done from beginning to end.

Our plans quite often are different from those of God.

Isaiah 55:8-9 "For My thoughts are not your thoughts, and your ways are not My ways." This is the Lord's declaration. "For as heaven is higher than earth, so My ways are higher than your ways, and My thoughts than your thoughts.

God's plans don't always make sense. We have two options how to respond though.

 A. Rebel, ignore, and avoid His plan
B. Trust Him and follow The Bible is full of people who trusted and followed even when it didn't make sense.

Moses, Noah, David, Job Mary, Joseph, Jesus

5. Satisfaction occurs when we join the work of God.

Vs. 14-15

What is God's work?

Redemption

Ecclesiastes 3:14-15 | know that all God does will last forever; there is no adding to it or taking from it. God works so that people will be in awe of Him. Whatever is, has already been, and whatever will be, already is. God repeats what has passed.

The work of God is

-eternal 14a -perfect. 14b -constant 15
